#### PASTOR'S REFLECTION

## Embracing hope in a turbulent world

In today's world, conflicts are widespread. Nearby, there's a country deeply divided. Many places suffer from war and hardship, shaping people's lives. The media often adds to this by highlighting scary and hopeless stories, filling our minds with fear.

But even amidst dire warnings of environmental catastrophe and societal collapse, there is a perspective that we shouldn't forget: Hope.

Insights from global experts challenges prevailing narratives of doom, revealing a world where progress flourishes. From declining child mortality to diminishing conflict, evidence suggests that humanity is moving towards a brighter tomorrow. Our greatest gift to future generations is the gift of hope.

"To relate expectantly to the Possibility of the Good is to hope," says Søren Kierkegaard in *Works of Love*. But you can also relate differently to the possibilities of the future. You can fear them.

The point is that the decision of hope is more radical than that of fear. Because in hope, you always choose to believe in the possibility of good and thus the future remains open. Fear fears the future and the possibility, and by that closing in on itself.

Hope enables us to embrace the future with positivity, even in the absence of clear indicators. It involves trusting in life and the potential for better days ahead, imbuing significance into our present experiences. Each day, hope offers an additional layer of optimism, fostering a sense of possibility and anticipation.

Choosing hope means affirming the possibility of goodness amidst uncertainty. This stands in stark contrast to succumbing to fear, which closes off opportunities and stifles growth. By embracing hope, we keep the door open to positive outcomes, even amidst turmoil and distress.

Hope and faith are intimately intertwined, as both entail trusting in something greater than ourselves. It involves surrendering to the belief that the world holds promise and goodwill, even in the face of adversity. Ultimately, hope allows us to entrust our future to a force we believe will guide us towards goodness and prosperity.

The Consulate was present at the Arctic 360 Conference held in Toronto in February.

Ambassador, Hanne Fugl Eskjær, participated in the Annual Ambassadors Roundtable Discussion alongside ambassadors and representatives from Canada, Greenland, Norway, Finland, Iceland, Sweden and USA.

Meanwhile, Arctic Senior Trade Advisor, Helene Scherling Olsen, represented our Arctic Business Alliance members at the conference where she participated in a panel discussion about enhancing trade lanes and relations in the arctic – in particular
