"Hygge rimer på tygge"

At the Thanksgiving Dinner, Sune, the President of the church board said these words in his speach. It translates to: "Hygge rhymes with chewing." There's quite a bit of truth to that statement, I think, Hygge is absolutely connected to food.

And just the other night when I had a nice time with our oldest daugther she said to me: "Mom, it is always so hyggeligt when we have something to eat together."

So much of the Danish culture, maybe even any culture, is connected to food. Whether it be at the holidays or even just the weekday dinner where the heritage of the homeland is undeniable. Frikadeller, tarteletter or a homemade loaf of rvebread. Nothing beats that taste of home.

The traditional Christmas Bazaar is just around the corner and we are excited. The import of Danish goods means that we can provide people with Danish food and candy. And the café with smørrebrød. gløgg and æbleskiver will also once again make people feel like coming home. We look forward to bringing a little piece of Denmark to you. And

we do hope you have a good time.

But writing this I find myself a bit puzzled over the idea of "Hygge". Because we can of course try and orchestrate "hygge" in the setting, but it cannot be manufactered. And even though it is often

connected with food it is so much more than that.

Hygge is a feeling, an atmosphere that cannot be forced. And hygge is not a goal - it is what happens when we are. Because the concept of hygge is relational and social and the special feeling of hygge happens when we feel safe and have trust in one another.

In fact the Danish existentialist Kierkegaard even says that we burst the bubble of that certain feeling if we put it into words. So we can't even verbalize hygge as it happens. Then we ruin it.

So I hope you have a hyggelig Christmas - remember it is what happens when we are together in a trusting invironment. Just being and sharing that moment. Then hygge will occur.
